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# DRAWER PULLS

## SUPPLIES

- Maryland China Drawer Pull TH5376
- Sakura Pen Touch Gold
- Sakura Souffle Pens
- Sakura Glaze Pens
- Scratch Paper
- Pencil
- Optional: Nail Polish or Gel Medium


## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place your Maryland China Drawer Pull onto the end of a pencil. The pencil acts like a handle, allowing you to hang on to it without actually having your fingers all over it.
2. To get the ink in your Pen Touch paint pen flowing, shake it (with the cap on). Remove the cap and press in the tip against some scrap paper until you see the ink flowing.
3. To create the flower: Draw a circle. Surround the circle with five round petals (a half circle shape). Keep adding petals (half circles) until you have several layers of them.
4. Test your coloring pen on a scrap piece of paper to make sure that the ink is flowing nicely. You want a really juicy flow. You can use either a Souffle pen (for an opaque look) or a Glaze pen (for a transparent look).
5. Color in the petals. Let dry.
6. Color in the background of your knob. Again, you can use either a Souffle pen or a Glaze pen. If the ink in your pen doesn't seem to be flowing, write on some scratch paper a few



times and it will get going again. Let dry.

7. Once the flower ink is dry add white dots with a Souffle pen to the petals.
8. Optional: You can also add another layer of color to the background as long as it's dry.
9. Because drawer pulls get a lot of handling, you will need to seal it. You will get a very different look depending on what you use. Clear nail polish changes the finish of the Souffle pens. Matte gel medium will flatten and dull everything. Glossy gel medium will make everything look shiny. You can

even use a clear crackle medium for a crackled finish! The choice is entirely up to you!
